## **Yukon advisory committee to support work of National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls in Yukon**

Joint news release

In preparation for the work of the national inquiry in Yukon and the ongoing issue of violence against Indigenous women, the Yukon advisory committee on missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls (MMIWG) has been re-established.

The advisory committee will continue the work of bringing together governments, agencies, communities and families to share information and guide our common work during the inquiry. The committee is co-chaired by Minister responsible for the Women's Directorate Jeanie Dendys, Kwanlin Dün First Nation Chief Doris Bill and Yukon Aboriginal Women's Council president Doris Anderson.

The goal of this advisory committee is to support the work of the commission of the national inquiry while ensuring this work meaningfully integrates the voices of Yukon families of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls. The advisory committee is also committed to further action on the urgent issue of violence against Indigenous women and girls without delay as a result of waiting for new recommendations and the conclusion of the inquiry.

#### Quick facts

- The Yukon delegation that attended the national roundtable requested a regional process in advance of the second national roundtable. As a result, an interagency committee called the Yukon Advisory Council on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls was established to provide direction to a family gathering and a Yukon roundtable on MMIWG.
- The Government of Yukon, alongside the Government of Canada and all other provinces and territories, has publicly communicated its intention to support and participate in the national inquiry.
- The national inquiry commissioners announced that the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls will start in Yukon with family hearings during the week of May 29 to June 2, 2017.
- In preparation for these hearings, regional advisory meetings are taking place across the country, including in Yukon from April 11 to 13 at the Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre.
