

# OUTBREAK PRECAUTIONS

*We keep Citizens and staff safe while offering KDFN services.*

## CITIZENS



- Keep within your limited social bubbles.
- Refrain from gathering at your home. Now is not the time to party.
- Citizens are encouraged practice the Safe 6 + 1.
- All citizens are discouraged from travelling.
- Updated pandemic-related safety signs are placed in prominent places throughout the community.
- Citizens may access critical services by appointment or phone.
- Funerals and potlatches have restrictions and must have a public health assessment completed. Attendees must practice social distancing and Safe 6 + 1.
- Citizens are asked to contact the Natsékhi Kù Health Centre (867-668-7289) if:
  - They need additional support.
  - They need mental health support.
  - They have questions or are unsure of how to proceed.

## STAFF

- All critical service staff still come to work.
- If a staff member has been in contact with someone who is supposed to be self-isolating and is not sure whether they should come to work, they should contact their supervisor.
- All KDFN worksites have continued appropriate sanitation protocols in place.
- Any number of staff are able to work in a KDFN office, provided they are able to maintain a two-metre distance from each other. Staff who are able to work from home maybe asked to do so by their Director.
- All work-related travel outside of KDFN Traditional Territory is suspended.
- All staff are expected to practice the Safe 6 + 1.

## KDFN GOVERNMENT

- All offices are closed to the public. Critical services are available by appointment only.
- Reduced public programming. Programming/events will be considered on a case by case basis.
- All KDFN worksites have increased sanitation protocols in place.
- Dusk'a is open to all children. Significant disinfectant procedures are in place
- Natsékhi Kù Health Centre is open for critical services by appointment only.
- All staff are expected to practice the Safe 6 + 1.
- Critical services for Elders are available by appointment only. Day programs for Elders are suspended.
- Council meetings may proceed online or in person, as long as a two-meter distance is established.
- Council's COVID-19 Emergency Directive #1 remains in place. If staff/clients have travelled outside the Yukon bubble or have had contact with someone who has travelled outside Yukon, they cannot enter a KDFN workplace for 14 days.

*While KDFN looks to the Chief Medical Officer of Health for guidance, there may be times where KDFN applies additional safety measures.*
